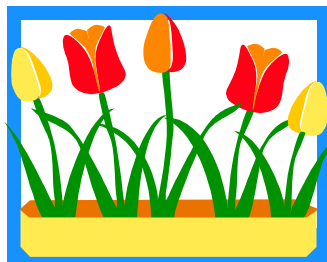

Welcome Back

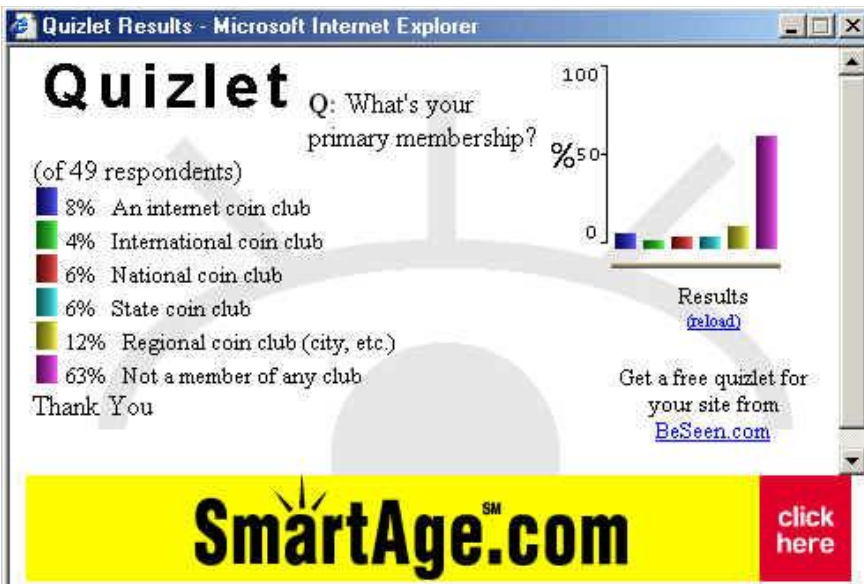

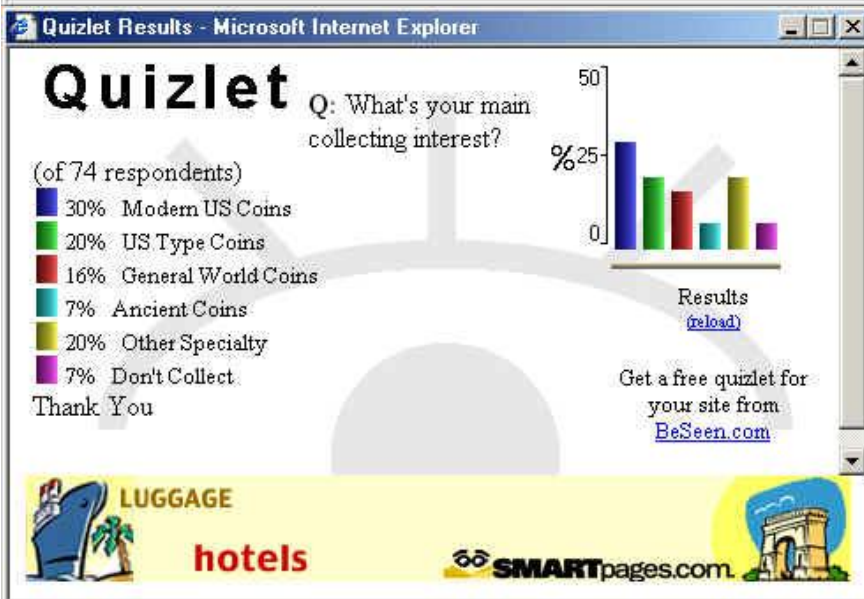
