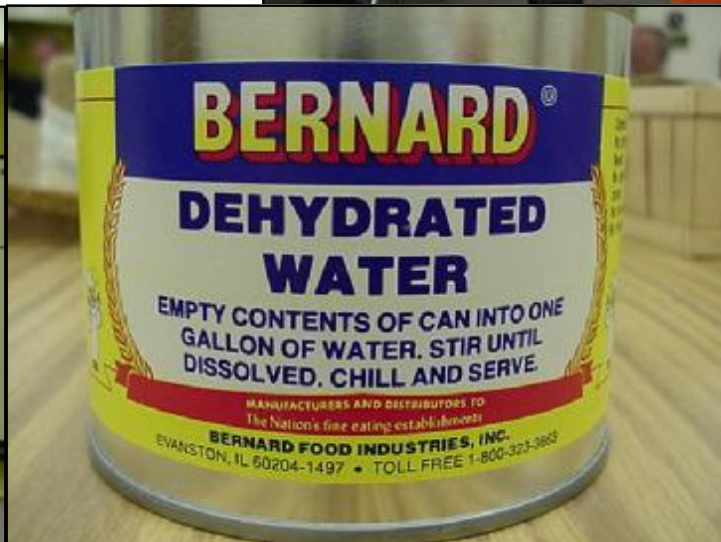
Thanks to our auctioneer, Oded Paz (pictured right modeling an apron up for auction), for generating the spirited bidding that resulted in this amount.

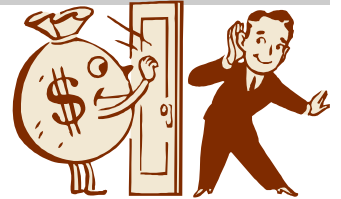
